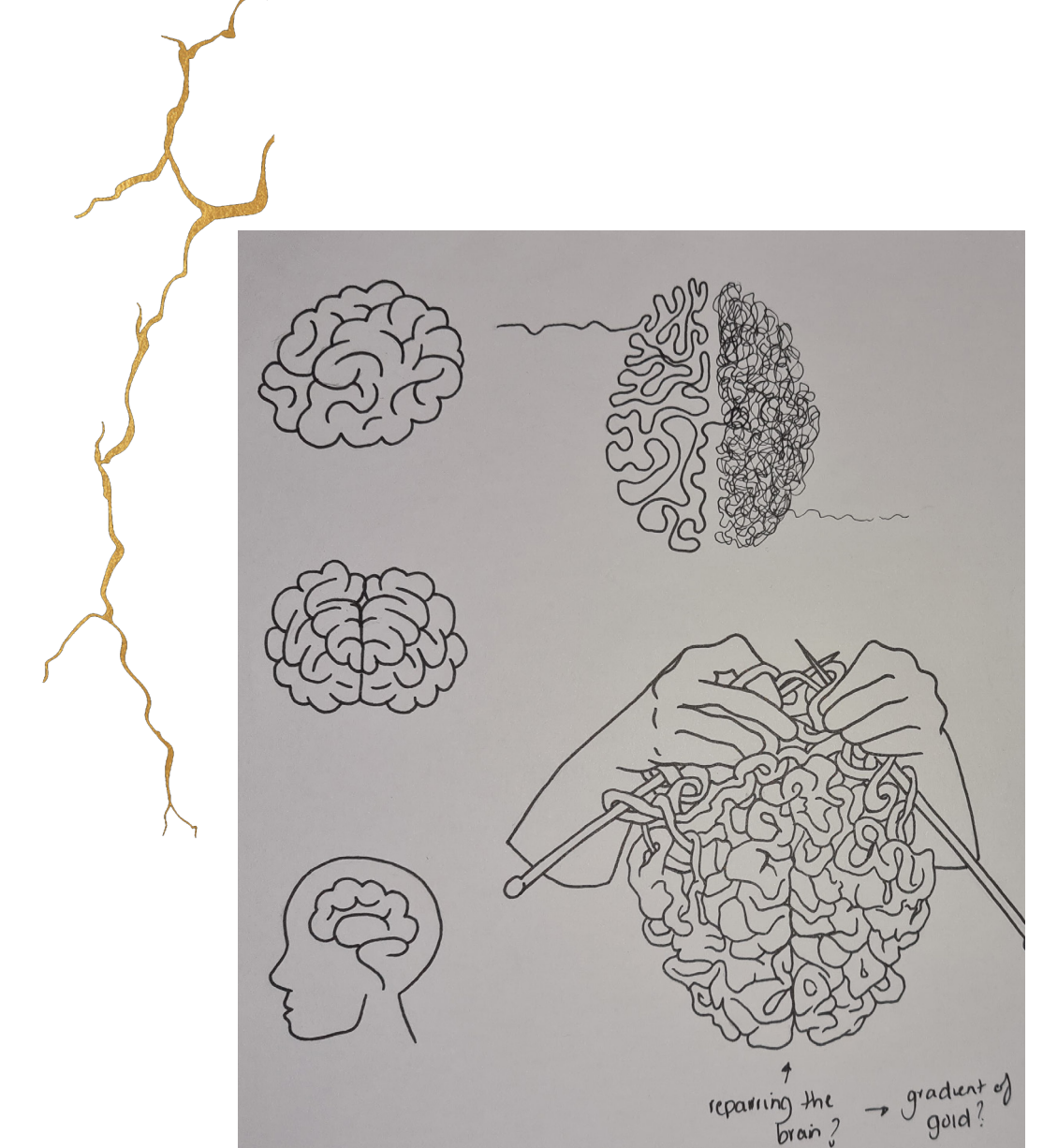
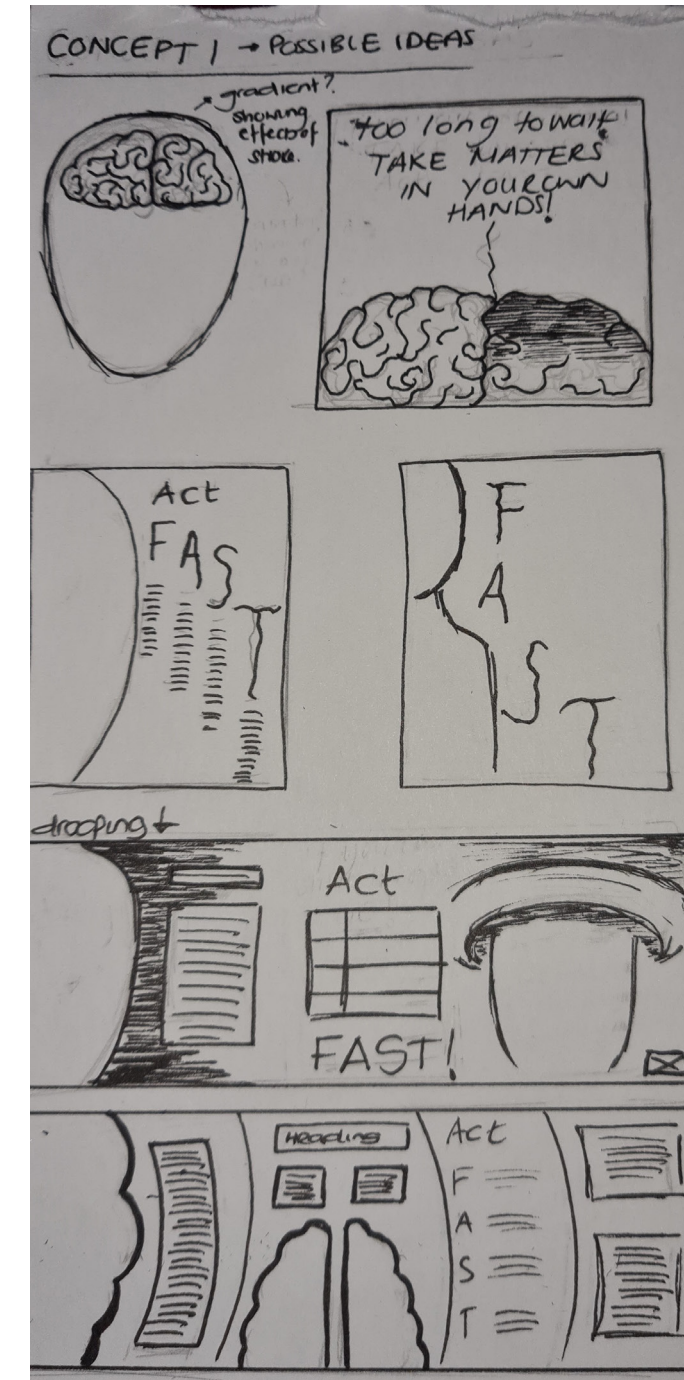
- TIME

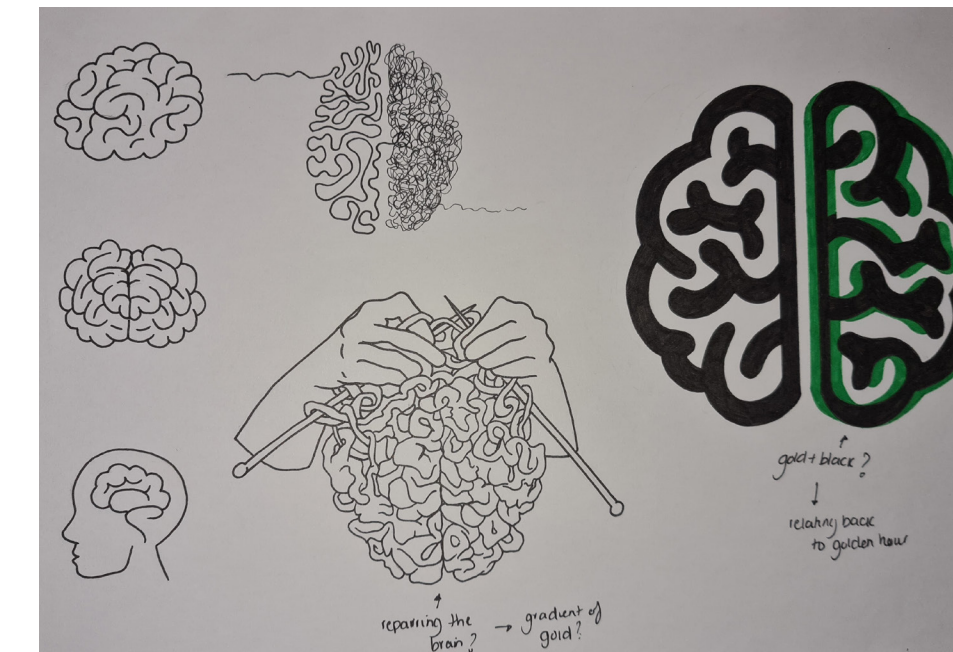
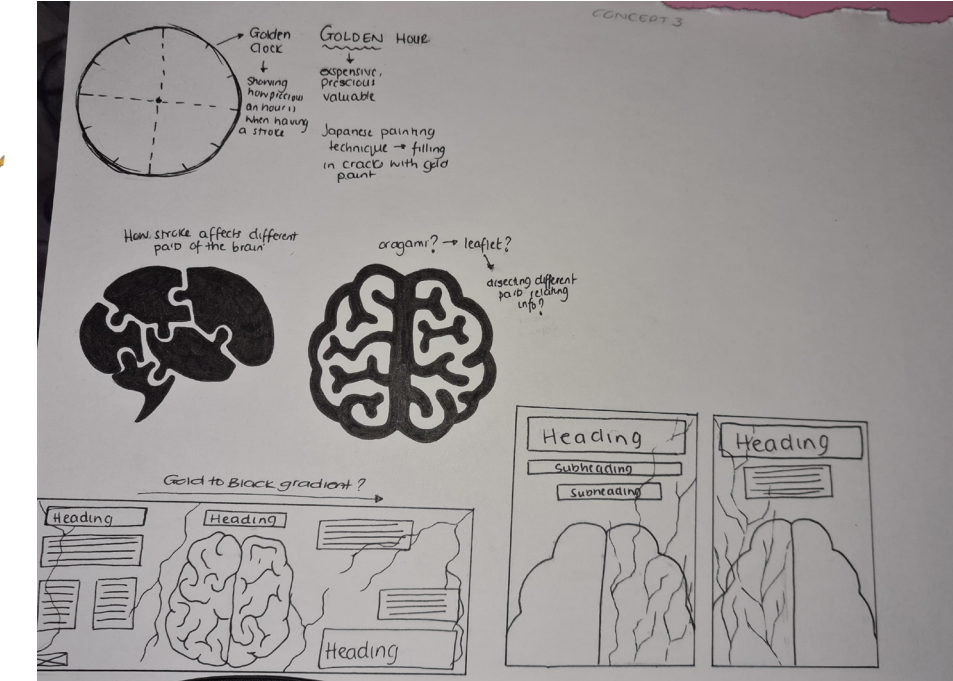
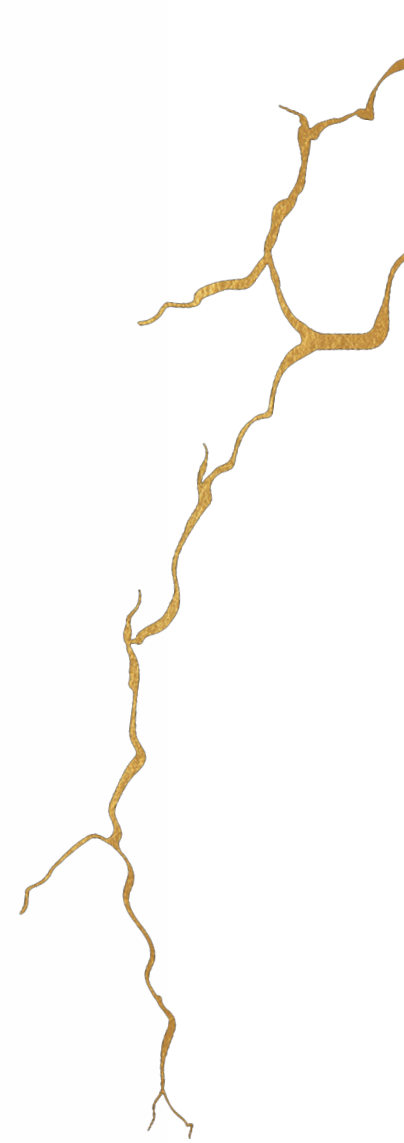
- GOLDEN HOUR

WHAT IS THE MESSAGE?

Stroke can strike anyone, anywhere and at anytime, so act FAST! and also how there is a 'Golden Hour' when it comes to strokes as patients have a greater chance of surviving and avoiding long term brain damage.

WHAT IS THE AIM?

The reason the first hour is golden is because stroke patients have a much greater chance of surviving and avoiding long-term brain damage if they arrive at the hospital and receive treatment with a clot-busting drug called TPA within that first hour and the main aim is to emphasise this message of the Golden Hour and how time is so important. To inform the Welsh Population of the seriousness of strokes by using shocking statistics and facts to show this and also to give them more information on the symptoms, what to do and what not to do when someone is having a stroke and also showcasing what happens when you do not get the treatment quick enough to avoid complications from a stroke.
